During Reading (20 min.)	<ul> <li>Listen to the Story</li> <li>Play [Listen to the Story]. Have children listen to the story. While listening, have them turn the pages accordingly.</li> <li>Play [Listen and Read Along]. Have children listen first, and then read along.</li> <li>Play [Listen and Repeat]. 
