Let's sing together.




- To make your own Humpty Dumpty, draw a face on an egg.





On the stove


The little teapot gets hot. It makes steam and shouts!





- B: It says "quack, quack, quack."





The little lamb runs around the classroom. The children laugh.




Mary, it is against the rules!

- Draw an oval in the middle of a piece of colored paper to make the lamb's body.
- 2 Cut four long strips of black paper for the lamb's legs and one short strip for its tail. Then glue them to the lamb's body.
- Oip your thumb in white paint and press it on the lamb's body to create the lamb's wool.
- Once the paint is dry, make the lamb's head out of black paper and glut it on. Be sure to add eyes!





Scene 3 In the field


The girl blows the horn again and again.



Let's count sticks!




[pointing at sticks] One, two, three, four, five, six. I count six sticks!

- Wrap the cube with colored paper. Finish your die by writing a number from one (1) to six (6) on each side.
- Start at one end of the room. Roll your die and take the number of steps you roll. Count your steps aloud.
- 4 The first person to make it to the other end of the room is the winner.
- **6** You can also use your die to play other board games.




