## Instructions for Teachers

Materials: a coin, two game pieces

* Grouping: two teams
* Instructions: (1) Divide the class into two teams.
(2) Have one student from each team play rock-paper-scissors to decide which team starts first.
(3) Sl flips the coin and moves the game piece to the corresponding space.
(4) One of SI's teammates asks Sl the question 'What do you see?'
(5) If Sl answers correctly, the team gets the allotted points for that space.

If Sl answers incorrectly, they go back to where they were before their turn.

(7) The team with the most points at the end wins.

## 2

Materials: a box, flashcards (B2-Units 05, 06)

- Grouping: two teams
* Instructions: (1) Put the flashcards in the box.
(2) Divide the class into two teams and decide which team will start by playing rock-paper-scissors.
(3) Sl picks a card out of the box and finds the corresponding picture on the worksheet.
(4) One of Sl 's teammates asks a question and Sl should answer the question.
(5) If Sl answers correctly, the team gets the allotted points for that space.
(6) Have each team take turns picking cards and asking questions.
(7) The first team to reach 10 points wins the game.
