Blue whales are (15) meat eaters.

They (16) eat 40 million shrimp-like (17) creatures called krill (18) every day.

They eat about 7,936 (19) pounds (3,600 kilograms) of (20) krill in a (21) single day.

(1) Camels have (2) large mounds of fat called (3) humps on their (4) backs.

One-hump (5) camels have (6) short hair and (7) come from the Middle East.

Two-hump camels (8) have longer hair and come from Mongolia.

They (11) get energy and (12) nutrition from their (13) humps.

They (14) allow camels to (15) carry heavy supplies across a hot (16) desert without

(17) food or drink.

(18) When a camel needs to (19) eat, its (20) empty hump will (21) become soft and
