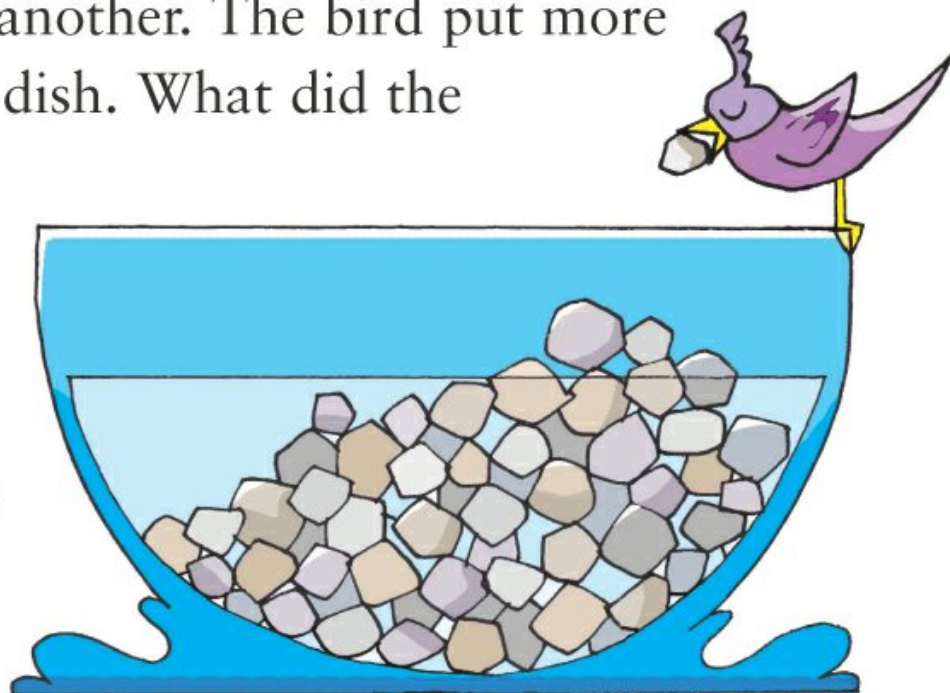

## The Thirsty Bird

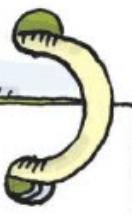
