

- They have two feelers, or barbels, that hang from their mouth.

- If their prey is stuck between two rocks, nurse sharks can simply place their large lips over the hole and suck it out.

- Tiger shark: They are called the "trash cans of the sea" because they will eat almost anything.
  - They spend their time in deep waters.
  - They are among the few species that attack humans.

Hammerhead shark:	- They live in warm, shallow water.
	- They swim south in the winter and north in the summer.
	- They usually hunt at night.

- The smallest hammerhead shark is a bonehead.
